

# FLEX(POINT)ING HEAD'S MUSCLE

Three more Flexpoint models from HEAD—130g, 140g and 150g

**A** couple of months ago, we introduced you to the HEAD Flexpoint 160g. You know, the stick with the holes bored into the frame at 3 and 9 o'clock. Well, HEAD wouldn't be HEAD without rolling out a fleet of models featuring their latest technology. So now we bring you the Flexpoint 130g, 140g and 150g. Like the 160g, the idea behind Flexpoint is to allow the frame to bend, or flex, upon impact with the ball to tame the power of these bad boys by improving the control. All of the Flexpoint models feature a thick handle, pack plenty of power and deliver virtually zero vibration. The differences lie in their weight distribution, design of the throat and their string patterns.

The Flexpoint 130g tipped the scales at 147g strung. It sports a closed throat, a tapered shaft that thins out near the head, and it is head heavy. The balance point being just below the bottom cross string enhances the power and helps offset the low weight. Bottom line is the 130g is easy to swing, is loaded with power but offers excellent touch for the short game.

The Flexpoint 140g weighed in at 164g strung, which surprised us because it actually came in a few grams heavier than the 150g. The reason, as best we can tell, is due to the fact that there is more string in the 140g. Because the 140g has an open throat, its head is wider at the bottom than its closed throat 130g and 150g brethren. As a result, there are 14 main strings in the 140g while there are only 12 mains in the 130g and 150g. That said, the 140g is also head heavy which makes it feel more stout than it really is. The result? Larger head size, head heavy and Flexpoint all add up to awesome power.

The Flexpoint 150g came in at 161g strung. Like the 130g, the 150g features a closed throat. But unlike the 130g, the 150g is evenly balanced, making it feel lighter than it is. Again, lots of power with excellent feel for the ball.
