

WILSON'S NEWEST nCODE STICKS

Three new models for 2006

Wilson's nCode™ line of racquets has three new siblings—the n135, the nRage and the nPro. We've told you about the technology behind the nCode™ racquets before, but here's a refresher course: on the molecular level, most racquets have small gaps between the molecules that create areas of weakness, but Wilson fills those gaps with "nanoscopic silicon crystals" to improve the stability of the frame (visit www.wilson.com for more info). The bottom line, according to Wilson, is that the racquets are twice as strong, twice as stable and 22% more powerful than other racquets.

The n135 is the only one of the three featuring a teardrop shape with longer

main strings to lengthen the sweetspot. Tipping the scales at 150g strung, the n135 is head heavy but swings easily. Power packed with the hefty head, the n135 also provides excellent feel for the ball due, in part, to the stiff frame. The n135 incorporates Wilson's Power Holes, which enhances the power by allowing the string to move a bit more.

Also coming soon is the nRage—a robust, evenly balanced stick weighing in at an impressive 167g strung. However, because it's evenly balanced, the nRage doesn't require a lot of muscle to get it up and running, yet it is loaded with power. With virtually zero vibration, the nRage is comfortable to swing and, with a tighter string pattern (there are 14 mains as opposed to 12 with the

other two models), offers additional control to harness the power.

The nPro is a stealthy 156g strung but feels much lighter, despite being head heavy. Like the nRage, the nPro has an open throat and smaller head than the n135, which results in a smaller sweetspot but more control when hit just right. The nPro also features Power Holes to pump up the power. Like the n135, the nPro swings effortlessly and offers plenty of power with excellent feel for the ball for the short game. It's maneuverability makes cutting the ball off a snap.
